

Experiences in SDS New Zealand

There are several models of self-direction in place in New Zealand, the largest model being Individualised Funding (IF). Current approximately 8,000 disabled people across New Zealand use individualised Funding in some iteration. The outcomes are transformational to the quality of people's lives, particularly in relation to choice, control and flexibility. A recent report released by a policy think tank in New Zealand has described IF as transformational, with overwhelming evidence of its effectiveness and advocates use of the model widely to improve people's lives dramatically. It empowers people to live the life they want, to have the people around them they choose and to have freedom to design and deliver their own supports in a way that suits them as individuals and families.
